

HealthPathways update

Pathways are now available for contraception and sterilisation which include all family planning and women's health services, IUD insertion providers, sperm storage and copper IUD stockists.

All acute and non-acute Diabetes referral pathways are now available on Health Pathways. These pathways contain up-to-date referral information for all WA public and private hospitals. More clinical Diabetes pathways have also been published including Renal Screening in Diabetes, Insulin Education by Practice Nurse, Hospital-based Diabetes Education, Foot Screening in Diabetes, Multidisciplinary Foot Ulcer Team (MDFUT), Insulin Pump Breakdown and Troubleshooting, Diabetes Medication Management.

Clinical Stream Working Groups

HealthPathways are recruiting for GPs to participate in the following working groups:

- Genetics (Thursday 1 September)
- Neurology (September, date tbc)

Working group participants will discuss current issues specific to the clinical stream and potential solutions. They will also assist GP clinical editors in pathway development – GPs can earn CPD points for partaking in a working group.

Aboriginal health - removal of blood glucose testing strips from the PBS

Practices are likely aware that blood glucose strips were removed from the PBS as of 1 July and must now be obtained from pharmacies via the National Diabetes Services Scheme (NDSS). Under new arrangements patients that currently receive subsidisation under Closing the Gap PBS Co-Payment (CTG script annotation) will continue to receive similar subsidisation under NDSS. However, as subsidisation has been available prior-1 July via the PBS Co-Payment, many Aboriginal patients have not also registered with NDSS.

Practices should:

- Consider running a report using clinical software to identify Aboriginal patients with diabetes.
- Check whether these have been registered for the PBS Co-Payment:
 - Where patients are registered for the PBS Co-Payment consider proactive patient follow-up or setting an alert to remind GPs to check whether patient is registered with NDSS at next visit, and complete registration form where necessary.
 - Where patients are not registered for the PBS Co-Payment consider setting an alert to remind GPs to complete PBS Co-Payment registration form at the next patient visit (and register patient for PIP Indigenous Health Incentive where appropriate). This will improve patient ability to access medications and follow treatment plans.

Medicare and eHealth PIP Hints

Medicare items: creating/updating Shared Health Summaries and My Health Records

GPs may not be aware that the time spent on reviewing a patient's clinical history, preparing/updating a shared health summary or preparing an event summary for an episode of care can be counted towards the total consultation time.

When these activities are undertaken with any form of patient history taking and/or the other clinically relevant activities that can form part of a consultation, the time that can be billed is the one with the time period that matches the **total** consultation time. The Medicare Benefits Schedule Book Category 1 details this information (please see page 30) and is available from MBS online.

Health Professionals Online Services (HPOS)

HPOS provides health providers, administrators, practice managers, practice staff and allied health access to a range of secure online services to streamline interactions with Medicare.

The Medicare Australia website has a range of e-learning modules to help you make the most of the functions and services available to support practices to use HPOS to do business with Medicare electronically (such as applying for practice incentives online and verifying patient details with Medicare and Department of Veterans Affairs). http://www.medicareaust.com/eClaiming/Welcome/index.html (choose interactive services, then start).

Practice Incentive Payments and HPOS

When a general practice owner applies for Practice Incentive Payments (PIP), he/she should nominate someone i.e. practice manager/business manager to be a **Listed Authorised Contact person(s)** to liaise on PIP matters on behalf of the owner.

The Authorised Contact is different from an Authorised Representative, Responsible Officer (RO) or Organisation Maintenance Officer (OMO)). If the owner cannot remember who is the Listed Authorised Contact Person(s) they can call **PIP Helpdesk 1800 222 032** to find out. If your general practice owner has access to HPOS, they should be able to add or remove Authorised Contact Person(s) within HPOS. Otherwise, they will need to fill out a 'practice incentives change of authorised person(s) form (IPO18). The form will need to be completed and signed by the owner. If there is more than one owner, one signature will suffice.

Both the owner and the authorised contact should register for a PRODA account even if they already have individual PKI certificates as these are being phased out and it is much easier to access HPOS via PRODA. This is a process that can be done online https://www.humanservices.gov.au/health-professionals/services/medicare/hpos and providing you have the details of 3 government issued identification documents, you will be accessing HPOS within 30 minutes.

Very important: once registered for PRODA, you must call the PIP helpline to record/link the PRODA RA (registered authority) number to enable PIP/PNIP access on HPOS. Anyone who is unfamiliar with HPOS is strongly advised to call the PIP Helpdesk for 5-10 minute guidance by the operator on how to navigate and use HPOS for PIP business as unfamiliarity with the system may cause delays in payments if errors are made using HPOS.

Provider Digital Access

Medicare is making it quicker and easier for health professionals to conduct all their Medicare business electronically through HPOS with the introductory of Provider Digital Access (PRODA). PRODA is the new alternative way to access HPOS with the online creation of username, password, identify verification and linking of records such as AHPRA and provider numbers.

The benefits to switching to PRODA include the ability to access HPOS from a smartphone or tablet, unlike the individual PKI Certificate smartcard/USB token. Medicare will move to doing all Practice Incentive Payment (PIP) business electronically.

Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR) update

PHN staff attended a workshop at the Australian Primary Health Care Nurses Association in May and received some useful feedback on common questions about the Register. This information was provided by Hope Peisley, Director of the Immunisation Branch of the Department of Health.

Q1. Some GP practices have been concerned that they have failed to upload immunisations onto the ACIR webpage. They have then had patients return to the practice angry and abusive. Are you aware of any software issues with ACIR?

Due to the expansion of ACIR under the changes of the 'no jab, no pay' legislation, the immunisation register experienced a large increase in the volume of immunisation encounters being received. This included a large amount of historical information for children over the age of seven years that had not previously been received by ACIR as well as a large amount of duplicate information. Due to the increase in the volume of reporting to ACIR a number of records were sent to a 'pend'

status which resulted in the immunisation information not appearing on an individual's record and being available to parents and vaccination providers. This issue has now been addressed with the 'pend' information being allowed to flow through to be viewed externally. We are unaware of any further issues with ACIR not receiving information – if further information can be provided ACIR can investigate further. Q2. What will the new reports look like for AIR? Many GPs are finding the reports difficult and challenging to interpret, and as such cannot do proper recalls and reminders. Will the reports look better? Could a dummy report be shared to Primary Health Network (PHN) staff?

The cosmetic look and feel of the reports available through the AIR secure site will not be changing with the expansion of the register from September 2016, however future enhancements will be made. Processing improvements with report generation have already been made resulting in reports being produced in real time within 1 hour of the vaccination provider submitting the request. From late September 2016 the existing reports will be extended to allow for a greater age range to be selected (up to 80 years and greater). Future changes to the reports will include greater information being available including (but not limited to), contact numbers, email addresses and vaccine trial information.

To assist providers with understanding the AIR as well as the reports available through the AIR secure site, the Department of Human Services has established a number of provider education modules. The modules will be available from their website from late September 2016.

Q3. In regards to Medicare batches and uploads, there was a problem with vaccines not uploading to Medical Director, and no notification was sent to the uploading practice. The glitch resulted from a mix of upper and lower characters being included which resulted in a failed upload. Due to this, hundreds of doses were stuck in the system. Can you please provide some information about the issue and if this is fixed?

The above issue is a result of the software that is being used at the practice and is prior to sending the encounter information to ACIR. Issues prior to data being transmitted through practice management software are between the practice and the software vendor. Unfortunately ACIR has no control over external software providers and we are limited to providing advice to the software vendors. ACIR does not directly communicate with software vendors; any information that relates to ACIR is sent via the Human Services Online Technical Support Team.
