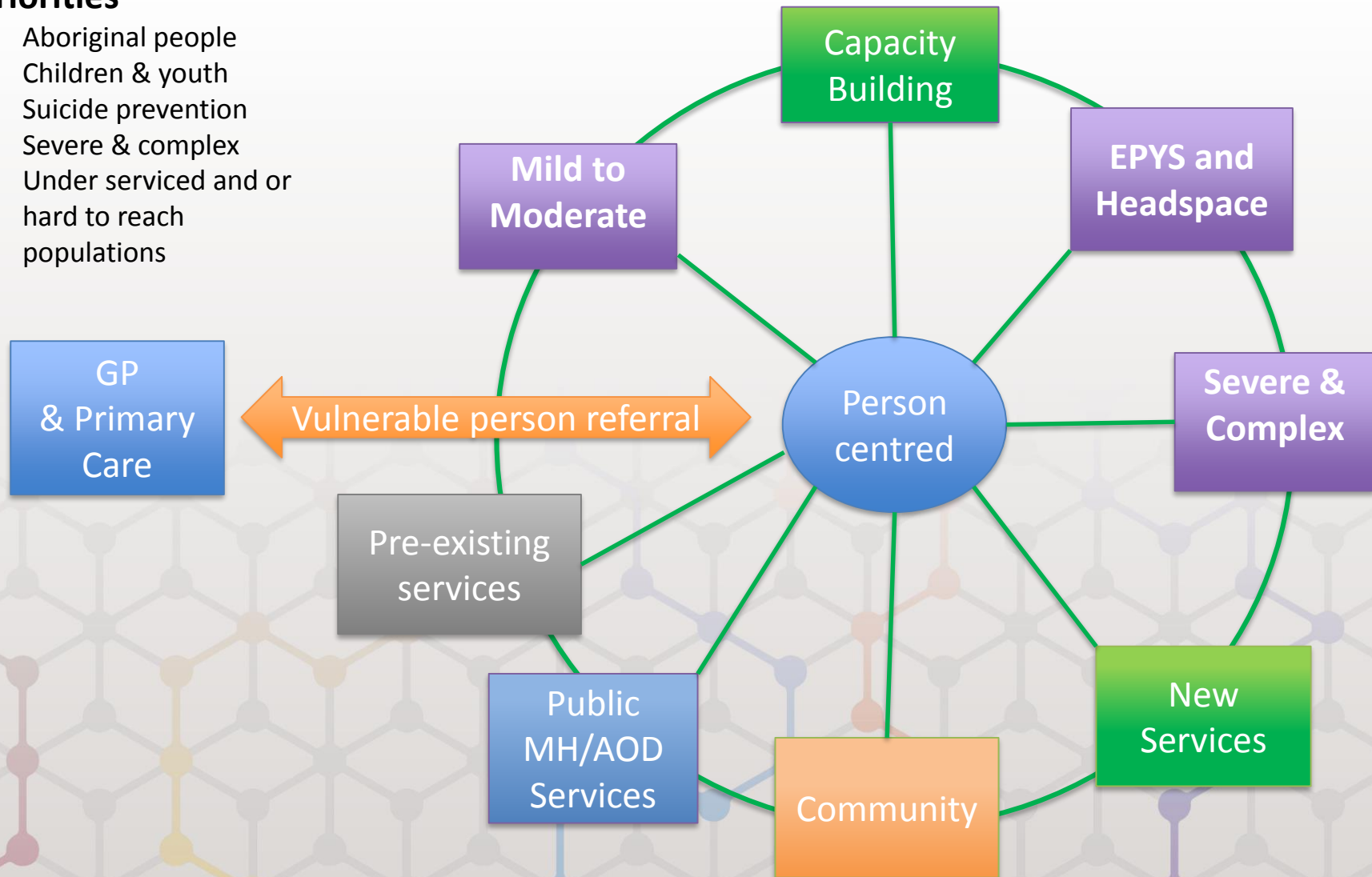

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HealthPathways WA

- Online portal designed by GPs for GPs
- Accessible by all health professionals – GPs, nurses, nurse practitioners hospital doctors specialists, allied health professionals
- Allows GPs to access concise information on clinical assessment, management and referral information during their consultations

Reporting requirements - Minimum Data Sets



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Primary Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set (PMHC MDS)

- Mental health service providers who deliver to individual clients
- Mandatory reporting commences July 1st
- Decide how to create upload files for the PMHC MDS
- Obtain an account on the PMHC MDS

Alcohol and Other Drug Treatment Services National Minimum Data Set (AODTS NMDS)

- AOD specific services
- New financial year for reporting commences July 1st
- Reported to the AIHW



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Primary Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set

The Commonwealth Department of Health has developed a new Primary Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set (PMHC MDS) to capture the expanded scope of mental health services to be delivered with Integrated Mental Health Stepped Care Models of service delivery.

WA Primary Health Alliance is responsible for supporting contracted service providers to meet their data collection and reporting requirements.

From 1 July 2017 all organisations contracted by WAPHA to deliver individual client mental health services under Primary Mental Health Care funding will be required to enter data into the new PMHC MDS.

About the Primary Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set:

The data set will be used by WA Primary Health Alliance and the Commonwealth Department of Health to understand service delivery and to inform future improvements in the planning and funding of primary mental health care services.

What are the next steps for service providers?

Service providers can commence submissions from May 1 to the PMHC MDS ahead of mandatory compliance from 1 July 2017.

Service providers need to ensure the following:

1. Decide how to create upload files for the PMHC MDS
2. Update client forms, including new client consent requirements
3. Obtain an account on the PMHC MDS

Primary Mental Health Care and Alcohol and Other Drugs Minimum Data Sets



The Commonwealth Department of Health has developed a new Primary Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set (PMHC MDS) to capture the expanded scope of mental health services to be delivered with Integrated Mental Health Stepped Care Models of service delivery purchased by PHNs.

Additionally, services funded by PHNs for Alcohol and other drug treatment services (AODTS) will be required to enter data to the AODTS Minimum Data Set.

PMHC MDS Service Provider Quick Reference Guide - Released!

It contains the release of a Service Provider Quick Reference Guide, which contains many of the answers to questions you may have. This Guide is also saved in the document library.

Key Points include:

- Why collect data?
- What data am I expected to collect and when?
- Does the client have to provide consent?
- What's different from the former ATAPS/MHSRRA MDS and MHNIP reporting?

Recommended Changes to Client Consent Forms

WAPHA suggests using the following wording to gain client consent, taken from the [Department of Health](#).

"I consent to my information being provided by WAPHA to the Department of Health to be used for statistical and evaluation purposes designed to improve mental health services in Australia. I understand that this will include details about me such as date of birth, gender and types of services I use but will not include my name, address or Medicare number. I understand that my information will not be provided to the Department of Health if I do not give my consent."

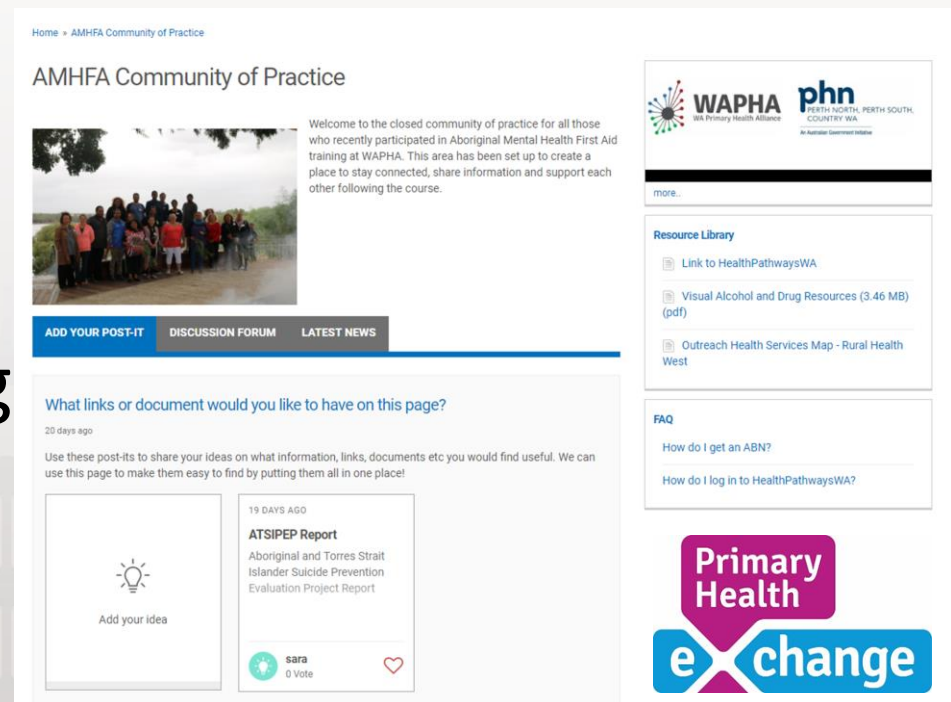
