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Welcome to Practice Connect, a fortnightly update for practice managers, nurses and practice administration staff on relevant issues, upcoming events and education. Changes to ENT referral criteria

From 1 July 2017, the Department of Health's Central Referral Service (CRS) has changed the ENT referrals criteria for adult rhinosinusitis, tonsillitis, tinnitus, vertigo, otitis externa, hearing loss and removal of ear wax.

Only referrals requiring specialist-level care will be accepted. WAPHA is supporting GPs with these changes by updating and adapting information on HealthPathways for WA. GPs can consult HealthPathways for the referral criteria for the ENT conditions listed above as well as for information regarding primary care management of these conditions. HealthPathways has already localised the pathways for the following conditions:

- Ear Wax
- Otitis Externa

The pathways for the following conditions are currently in the process of being adapted for WA. These include:

- Hearing LossRhinosinusitis
- Rhinosinusi
- Tinnitus
- Tonsillitis
- Vertigo

They will be published as they become available however they still contain useful condition assessment and management information as well as the new referral criteria. If you have any queries regarding HealthPathways, please email <u>healthpathways@wapha.org.au</u>.

Reminder: ePIP quarter closes on 31 July

Practices registered for the ePIP will need to ensure they have uploaded enough shared health summaries to My Health Record within this quarter to meet their minimum requirement. This is 0.5% of your Standard Whole Patient Equivalent (SWPE) from the previous quarter, or a minimum of 5 summary uploads for new practices or those with a SWPE of 1000 or less.

The upload target is for the practice as a whole, not per GP. If you don't think you will reach your upload target it is recommended that you withdraw from the current quarter to avoid being asked to pay back any monies paid. This must be done prior to the end of the quarter via HPOS. Your Primary Health Liaison can check to see how many more summaries you may need to upload prior 31 July.

Immunisation Update

Influenza Vaccination During Pregnancy

Vaccination remains the best protection for pregnant women and their newborn babies against influenza.

Despite influenza vaccination being available free to pregnant women on the National Immunisation Program, vaccination rates remain low with only 1 in 3 pregnant women receiving the influenza vaccine. Influenza infection during pregnancy can lead to premature delivery and even death in newborns and very young babies. Pregnant women can have the vaccine at any time during pregnancy and they benefit from it all through the year.

Rabies

Rabies infection remains a problem worldwide with the virus enzootic in Asia, Africa, North and South America and parts of Europe, meaning that the virus is constantly presenting in animal populations in these areas. Although the majority of human rabies infections are caused by exposure to infected dogs, all mammals are susceptible to rabies. Bats may carry rabies-like viruses in countries which are declared rabies-free in terrestrial animals. Exposure to bats or their secretions should also be considered as a potential rabies risk wherever in the world this has occurred, including Australia.

For Western Australians, most potential rabies exposures occur in travellers to South East Asia who have sustained bite or scratch wounds from animals. Travellers to enzootic rabies regions should be advised to avoid contact with wild or domestic animals and educated on what to do if bitten or scratched by an animal while abroad. Pre-exposure vaccination for rabies virus and other lyssavirus is available on prescription for travellers to rabies enzootic areas and for persons at occupational risk of exposure. Post-exposure rabies prophylaxis, vaccination and, where required rabies immunoglobulin, is funded by the Health Department of Western Australia for persons exposed to bites or scratches overseas from terrestrial animals in enzootic countries and to persons exposed to bats either overseas or in Australia. Health practitioners can obtain further information on accessing post exposure prophylaxis for potential rabies or bat lyssavirus exposures for their patients by contacting the Metropolitan Communicable Disease Control team on 9222 8588 (office hours) OR the on-call duty officer on 9388 0553 (weekends, public holidays and after hours).

Medical Indemnity Insurance for Practice Nurses

All nurses must be covered by appropriate Professional Indemnity Insurance (PII) in order to practice and maintain registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA). Nurses may hold their own private PII or they may be covered by their employer's PII coverage for employees.

It is important that employers and nurses discuss whether and to what extent the practice's insurance covers nurses employed in the practice for professional indemnity. All parties should satisfy themselves that the insurance arrangements in place are adequate and seek independent advice if necessary.

Do you see patients with musculoskeletal disorders?

The University of Queensland is running a national survey targeting clinicians from different disciplines who see patients with musculoskeletal disorders. The survey below explores the attributes that clinicians require in order to help patients make use of these services and strategies. The success or failure of management strategies used by clinicians to manage patients with chronic musculoskeletal conditions often hinges on the patient's uptake of the recommended health services and strategies.
