HealthPathways Update

After-hours Care Pathway

After-hours care can be both challenging and rewarding. Many GPs are now working outside of normal operating hours and the HealthPathways team have identified after-hours care as an area of priority. We have recently reviewed the 'After-hours Care' pathway and hope that it will help you in your work.

For GPs working in after-hours care, it might interest you to know that there is a public emergency dental service operating on the weekends. We have compiled information on after-hours pharmacies, as well as after-hours pathology and radiology for important diagnostic investigations which can avoid a referral to ED. We have also collected a list of advice lines for GPs, as well as handouts to provide to patients who may need specific support in areas such as mental health, drug and alcohol or domestic violence.

For GPs whose practice does not provide an after-hours service, we have compiled a list of options for after-hours care which you can consider providing to your patients. National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP)

GP Learning Module

Are you confident about your role in the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program? An easy online learning module developed by Cancer Council WA and RACGP can provide you with the answers.

After logging in at http://gplearning.racgp.org.au, simply type 'bowel' into the search criteria and select the module. After completing the module, you will be able to:

- 1. List bowel cancer risk factors.
- 2. Describe the symptoms associated with bowel cancer.
- 3. Identify who is eligible for the NBCSP.
- 4. Identify those who should be screened for bowel cancer.
- 5. Recognise the duty of care associated with NBCSP participants.

Members will also receive 2 RACGP QI & CPD points for completing the module.

National Advance Care Planning Prevalence Study

The National Advance Care Planning Prevalence Study will help determine the prevalence of advance care planning documentation for people aged over 65 in hospitals, general practice and aged care homes. This is a Decision Assist initiative and supported by funding from the Australian Government. Applications to participate in the National Advance Care Planning Prevalence Study are now open to all accredited public, private hospitals, residential aged care homes and general practices.

Key dates

- Opening date for applications: 10 July 2017.
- Closing date for applications: 20 July 2017.
- All sites advised of outcome of application: 14 August 2017.
- Data collection commences: September/October 2017.

'Let's Get Candid About Codeine' awareness campaign

Medications containing codeine will no longer be available over the counter in pharmacies from 1 February 2018. Script Wise have developed an online information hub which launched with the 'Let's Get Candid About Codeine' awareness

campaign on 10 July, Monday. This campaign will ensure that health professionals and members of the community have a conversation about the use of these medications and consider other alternatives to manage pain.

The hub's resources will target three key groups: community members, GPs, and pharmacists. It features:

- A number of videos with experts in the field,

- key information to support achieving better health outcomes.

World Hepatitis Day 2017

World Hepatitis Day 2017 calls for a reminder to all primary care providers of their vital role in Viral Hepatitis elimination in Australia. With the availability of effective vaccines and treatments for hepatitis B and a cure for hepatitis C, the elimination of viral hepatitis is achievable and this is the theme of World Hepatitis Day 2017. With close to half a million Australians living with chronic hepatitis B and C, it is likely there is someone who attends your practice living with hepatitis. It is vital for primary care providers to know the risk factors, test and diagnose people living with hepatitis to enable treatment to start early enough to halt serious liver damage. Important changes to the Living is for Everyone (LIFE) project

As of 30 June 2017, the Living is for Everyone (LIFE) project has been transferred to the Hunter Institute of Mental Health. Previously managed by On the Line, the LIFE project is aimed at improving access to suicide and self-harm prevention activities, as well as improving communication between suicide prevention stakeholders in Australia. The LIFE project including resources and website will be absorbed into a new national project, Life in Mind.

The purpose of Life in Mind is to connect organisations, programs, researchers and professionals working in suicide prevention in Australia, by providing a comprehensive online portal. The aims of Life in Mind include supporting coordinated, consistent messaging around suicide prevention through the operationalisation of the National Communications Charter, linking policy to practice, communities to help-seeking and practitioners to the evidence base. It is anticipated that Life in Mind will better support people to communicate about, and respond to, suicide and its impacts.

A comprehensive national consultation process is currently underway to inform the development of the new portal and associated resources. While the new online portal is being developed, the www.lifeinmindaustralia.com.au splash page is now available. This includes some basic information about Life in Mind, the LIFE Framework and selected fact sheets.


