The HealthPathways Team has recently reviewed and updated the 'Immunisation – Childhood' pathway which you can now access at: <u>https://wa.healthpathways.org.au/45076.htm</u>. HealthPathways GP Clinical Editor, Dr Richa Tayal reviewed the pathway with the assistance of Clinical Liaison Officer, Danelle Robertson. Clinical review was also undertaken by the Communicable Disease Control Directorate at WA Department of Health.

The HealthPathways Team improved the structure of the 'Immunisation – Childhood' pathway, making it easier for GPs and other health professionals to read and navigate. The pathway also links to the updated WA Immunisation Schedule. By clarifying the requirements and process of immunisation this pathway will assist in improving childhood immunisation rates in WA.

The 2017 WA Influenza Immunisation pathway was launched in April and the following immunisation pathways are planned for review in 2017:

- Immunisation Adolescents
- Immunisation Adults
- Vaccine Storage and Cold Chain Breaches
- Travel Vaccination and Advice
- Pertussis Vaccine for Pregnant and Post-Partum Women

NPS MedicineWise Update

NPS MedicineWise educational visits for GPs are also available as **web-enabled** virtual visits.

Web-enabled sessions are delivered directly to individual practices by the NPS Clinical Services Specialists using Skype for Business. The sessions provide an interactive environment for one-on-one discussion with GPs and as such, they qualify under the current RACGP and ACRRM agreements:

- RACGP: accredited for 2 (Category 2) points in the QI CPD Program for the 2017-2019 triennium.
- ACRRM: Accredited for 1 Core point in the ACRRM PD Program for the 2017-2019 triennium.

NPS MedicineWise virtual visits are also recognised by the Practice Incentives Program as contributing toward the Quality Prescribing Incentive (PIP QPI).

Immunisation Update

State wide Men ACWY vaccine now available to general practice

All General Practices in WA can now order meningococcal ACWY vaccine for administration to persons aged 15 to 19 years as part of the WA state wide Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program.

Under this program, all persons aged 15-19 years are eligible for a single dose of Meningococcal ACWY vaccine through to 31 December 2017.

Before the end of the year, GPs are urged to offer Meningococcal ACWY vaccination to any age-eligible patients who have not already been vaccinated through school or university immunisation clinics.

GPs are encouraged to bulk bill eligible patients who attend only to receive the meningococcal ACWY vaccination.

How to order meningococcal ACWY Vaccine – Nimenrix [®]:

- 1. Go to the usual vaccine ordering website <u>https://wa.tollhealthcare.com</u>.
- 2. Click on the tab marked 'School, Catch-up and Refugee vaccines'.
- 3. Select 'Men ACWY Nimenrix 0.5 mL catch up for 15 to 19 years'.

IMPORTANT: Use a 23-gauge needle when reconstituting the Nimenrix[®] meningococcal ACWY vaccine as larger needles may shear the vial stopper.

Menveo (Meningococcal ACWY) GSK supply update

GSK is pleased to confirm Menveo (Meningococcal Groups A, C, W-135, and Y Oligosaccharide CRM197 Conjugate Vaccine) is back in supply, following a supply constraint. The Menveo stock available for order has an expiry of April 2018.

Menveo has a Therapeutic Goods Association approval of a new infant indication (two months and above) from July 2017. Menveo is the only ACWY conjugate vaccine approved for use in infants from two months of age.

Short-Term Restorative Care for Older People

Older West Australians who need intensive support to help them remain living in their own home can now access a Short-Term Restorative Care program.

The goal of the program is to improve the person's ability to care for themselves, preventing a loss of independence, social isolation, and premature entry to high level community services or residential aged care. The services are delivered in the individual's home and include, but are not limited to: Occupational Therapy; Physiotherapy, Nursing, Social Work, Speech Pathology, Dietician, Podiatry and Direct Care.

To access the service, an individual will need to be referred to the Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) for an assessment. People considered eligible include those who:

- are slowing down mentally, or physically, or both
- need help with everyday tasks
- want to stay independent, and out of long-term residential care.

The program is not available to people who are receiving a home care package (however HACC & DVA (Veterans Assist or Direct Care Clients are eligible); are a resident of a nursing home; or have been in hospital within the last three months with a condition related to their current need for short term restorative care.

Individuals are allowed two periods of Short-Term Restorative Care in one year.

This service is funded by the Commonwealth Government but individuals are asked to make a contribution of approximately 5% of the daily costs which equals \$10.10 a day. This is based on 17.5% of the daily aged pension, however the cost can be negotiated in cases of financial hardship.

Graduate Certificate in Continence Promotion and Management

The Continence Foundation of Australia (CFA) is offering Registered Nurses and Physiotherapists a limited number of positions to The Benchmarque Group's *Graduate Certificate in Continence Promotion and Management*.

As part of a successful application, the CFA will pay \$1,965.00 of the full course fee of \$2,965.00 (Inc GST). Students will be required to make a co-payment of \$1,000.00 (inc GST) and complete the assessment by 1 November 2018.

The positions are offered in a 100% distance-based format and all training resources are provided. The course will require approximately nine months of study including essential reading, external reading and completion of the assessment portfolio. The assessment portfolio also requires 32 hours of self-arranged clinical placement.

Applications close on Friday, 29 September 2017.
