**Professor Leon Flicker** is the Director of the Western Australian Centre for Health and Ageing (WACHA), partnered with the Medical School of the University of Western Australia. He helped initiate Memory Clinics in Victoria and Western Australia. Professor Flicker's research within UWA Medical School focuses on the major health issues of older people, exploring general health, falls, depression, dementia and cognitive impairment. He has conducted numerous studies on frailty and successful ageing and has also researched the health needs, especially those associated with cognitive impairment, of older Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.
