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The Urgent Care PGL program is designed to maximise the benefits of working and learning together in a peer group educational setting.

This activity utilises peer support, interaction and reflection to enhance clinical competence, knowledge, skills, attitudes and performance of practices on specific urgent care topics.

It is the ideal format for GPs to share their knowledge and discuss urgent care cases with peers and other health professionals within their own practice with the assistance of a facilitator, and in some cases local subject matter experts.

## PGL Requirements

The Urgent Care PGL program will be mapped out for your practice and consists of standardised templates, facilitator guides, case study frameworks and all administration requirements.

In practice activities will include:

- · planning meeting
- · at least 4 hours of education activity which can be face to face or virtual, and
- · review meeting

Upon completion of the Urgent Care PGL, GPs will be provided 40 CPD Accredited Activity Points. The Urgent Care PGL also counts towards CPD hours and links to the Professional Performance Framework (PPF).

## **PGL** Topics

There are four topic options. These include:

- Mental Health
- Abdominal Pain (gastro/urinary/gynaecological)
- Wounds (chronic/acute/burn)
- Common musculoskeletal (wrist/hands/ankles)
