primary healthcare providers with the
tools, education and resources to safely
and sensitively support patients with weight
concerns to improve their health and
wellbeing outcomes. This is an initiative of
the WA Healthy Weight Action Plan.

Chronic Heart Failure

Established a Chronic Heart Failure
Expert Reference group to inform, guide
and support the development and delivery
of our Chronic Heart Failure Pilot project.

Immunisation and Cancer Screening

Supported general practices to improve child, adolescent, and adult vaccination coverage across WA and encourage the promotion of and participation in Australia's three cancer screening programs (breast, bowel, cervical) among their patient population.
