Over the upcoming weeks we will provide more information related to procurement and commissioning activities to occur in 2022-23. These activities are across a range of program areas including:

- Mental Health
- Aged Care, and
- Chronic Conditions

The activities in mental health specifically include expansion of the Head to Health footprint here in Western Australia, and a number of suicide prevention activities, amongst others.

In parallel to this, you will be aware recently that the Australian and West Australian Governments entered into a <u>Bilateral National Mental Health and</u> <u>Suicide Prevention Agreement</u>. This commits both parties to implementation of agreed activities to 2025-26. This is an important agreement that will deliver tangible benefits to our communities, and strengthen governance arrangements across agencies (including with WA Primary Health Alliance),

WA Government COVID-19: What you can and can't do

#### Updated WA public health measures

Following the latest public health advice, the WA Government has issued the following update:

- Mask mandate on public and passenger transport to ease;
- This includes all interstate and intrastate aircraft, public transport and rideshare;

• Mask wearing still required in high-risk settings such as hospitals, prisons, aged and disability care facilities, with masks still encouraged to be worn in crowded indoor settings where people are unable to physically distance.

These changes came into effect from Friday 9 September 2022.

#### Fourth Dose

An additional booster, or fourth dose, is recommended for people at increased risk of severe illness. You should get a fourth dose if you are:

- 50 years or older
- 16 years or older and a resident of an aged care or disability care facility
- 16 years or older and severely immunocompromised
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and aged 50 years and older
- 16 years or older with a medical condition that increases the risk of severe COVID-19 illness
- 16 years or older with a disability

Vaccines can be <u>booked</u> 3 months after your last dose or COVID-19 infection.

## Australian Institute of Health and Welfare: Indigenous health checks and follow-ups report

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people can receive an annual health check, designed specifically for Indigenous Australians and funded through Medicare (Department of Health 2021). Indigenous Australians, as a group, experience unique health risks and aim of the Indigenous specific health check is to encourage early detection and treatment of common conditions that cause ill health and early death – for example, diabetes and heart disease.

During the health check, a doctor – or a multidisciplinary team led by a doctor – will assess a person's physical, psychological and social wellbeing (Department of Health 2021). The doctor can then provide the person with information, advice, and care to maintain and improve their health.

#### **WA Joint Services Planning and Governance Committee**

As a member of the WA Joint Services Planning and Governance Committee, WAPHA CEO, Learne Durrington joined WA Mental Health Commissioner, Jen McGrath, and Mark Rodham, First Assistant Secretary – Mental Health Division, Australian Department of Health and Aged Care for their first committee meeting 31 August.

Initially, the committee will meet every six weeks to:

- provide high-level leadership regarding local system planning to contribute to reform of the mental health, alcohol and other drug system in Western Australia.
- provide guidance to enable WAPHA and MHC to make informed decisions that meet the needs of local communities and ensure alignment and integration with Commonwealth and state-based services.

The Mental Health Commission and the Australian Department of Health and Aged Care have joint accountability to ensure the continued operation of the Committee for the duration of the Bilateral Schedule.
