WA Government COVID-19: What you can and can't do

COVID-19 and influenza (flu) video series for healthcare providers

The Child and Adolescent Health Service (CAHS), in conjunction with Professor Chris Blyth (Infectious Disease Physician), have developed the 'Talking COVID and Flu' short video series for healthcare providers, to facilitate discussions surrounding influenza and COVID-19.

- How bad is the flu this year? (1min44sec)
- Is Omicron as transmissible as reported? (60sec)
- How are the flu and COVID different? (53sec)
- Getting your flu vaccination after having COVID (51sec)
- Understanding immunity and cross infection (2min3sec), including:
 - o Can you be reinfected with COVID?
 - o Can you be infected with COVID and flu at the same time?
 - o If you have had COVID are you more immune to the flu?
- Are public health and safety measures still necessary? (2min4sec)
- What is long COVID and how do you prevent it? (1min50sec)
- Vaccine safety and side effects (COVID and flu vaccines) (2min4sec)

ATAGI recommendations on COVID-19 vaccine use in children aged 6 months to under 5 years

COVID-19 vaccination is now recommended by the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) for children aged 6 months to under 5 years with severe immunocompromise, disability, and those who have complex and/or multiple health conditions which increase the risk of severe COVID-19.

These include children with the following or similar conditions:

The recommendation is for two primary doses, except for those with severe immunocompromise who require three primary doses. The recommended interval between each dose is 8 weeks.

Latest ABS COVID-19 Mortality in Australia report released

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has released its COVID-19 Mortality in Australia: Deaths Registered until 30 June 2022 report.

To 30 June 2022, of the 8219 deaths reported to the ABS, COVID-19 was found to be the cause of death for 7057 people.

Men had the highest number of deaths from COVID-19 in every age group.

People aged 80 to 89 were most likely to die from COVID-19 in Australia.

Chronic cardiac conditions were the most common comorbidity, followed by dementia and diabetes.

TGA and rapid antigen tests

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has advised that four rapid antigen test products it recently cancelled was not due to a failure to detect the Omicron COVID-19 variant.

One test product was cancelled due to data requirements and the other three were cancelled by the suppliers who decided not to provide these products.

All rapid antigen tests available for sale in Australia, and those being distributed via the WA Government's free RAT program, are safe, effective and approved by the TGA.

The TGA website has a list of all RATs approved for use in Australia.

The Taskforce's remit is to recommend improvements that will benefit patients through improved access, greater affordability and better management of chronic conditions in primary care.

Help WA Health to communicate the impact of climate change on health

The University of Western Australia and Department of Health WA would like to hear from a wide range of WA healthcare professionals to better understand their views on the links between climate change and health.

This research follows on from the findings of the Sustainable Health Review and the Climate Health WA Inquiry led by the State's former Chief Health Officer, Professor Tarun Weeramanthri.

The project involves a short, fifteen-minute survey open to 22 August 2022.

The information gathered through this research will be used by WA Health to develop public health messaging and resources for both the community and health professionals.

Monkeypox Update

The Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care Chief Medical Officer Professor Paul Kelly has declared Monkeypox a communicable disease incident of national significance.

In Australia, there have been 44 cases of Monkeypox, with the WA detecting its first case in a traveller returning to the state from overseas.

The WA Department of Health has guidance on testing, use of PPE, management of contacts and reporting of Monkeypox.

Cases must be reported urgently by telephone to the Public Health Units (Healthy WA) within a few hours of first suspicion of diagnosis.

The Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care has prepared fact sheets and posters to help health professionals and patients identify Monkeypox.

The WA Department of Health is working with the Australian Government to secure limited supplies of vaccines for the prevention of Monkeypox. The Deputy Chief Medical Officer is presenting a special webinar on Monekypox which you can access here. The password is xgJPqVxb323 (94577892 from phones).

The End of Life Care Program within the Western Australian (WA) Department of Health, launched the revised Advance Health Directive (AHD), the new accompanying AHD Guide and advance care planning (ACP) resources for consumers and health professionals.

Understanding the use and availability of telehealth in residential aged care facilities

The Final Report: Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety identified several areas that affect aged care residents within the current health system including limited access to general practitioners (GPs) and allied health professionals within aged care facilities, difficulties accessing out of hours services and unnecessary hospital transfers. The report is available here.

The initiative will support timely access to primary health care professionals for residents and better equip RACFs with telehealth equipment, training and ongoing education to support access to virtual consultations with health professionals.

Delivering mental health care in general practice: Implications for practice and policy

The General Practice Mental Health Standards Collaboration (GPMHSC) recently commissioned qualitative and quantitative research amongst 864 GPs in Australia who had completed either Level 1 Mental Health Skills Training or Level 2 Focussed Psychological Strategies Skills Training.

The purpose of the research is to provide insights that will support the work of the GPMHSC and a base of evidence for formulating policy and practice relating to mental health and the upskilling of GPs in mental health.
