Aim of Activity

Strengthening primary health care and ensuring all Australians have access to affordable primary care services is a priority for the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care. The Department of Health and Aged Care allocated up to \$230.9 million over four years (2022-23 to 2025-26) for PHNs to assist with the establishment of 58 Medicare Urgent Care Clinics (Medicare UCCs) throughout Australia.

The Department of Health and Aged Care have developed the Medicare UCC policy to ease the pressure on hospitals emergency departments and give Australian families more options to see a suitably qualified and skilled healthcare professional when they have an urgent but not life-threatening need for care. All Medicare UCCs are required to provide bulk-billed services, be open during extended business hours and accept walk-in patients for specified urgent care presentations. This measure delivers on the Department of Health and Aged Care commitment to strengthen Medicare and make it easier to see a doctor, as published in the Plan for a Better Future.

Description of Activity

The Department of Health and Aged Care and Western Australian governments have entered into a bilateral agreement, with WA Primary Health Alliance (WAPHA) as designated commissioner, to deliver the Medicare Urgent Care Clinic in seven designated WA locations; focused on specified actions that are intended to reduce pressure on emergency departments.

WAPHA will conduct an expression of interest and formal competitive grant opportunity to identify and commission providers to deliver the Medicare UCC service in seven locations: Perth City, Clarkson, Rockingham, Morley, Midland, Bunbury, and Broome.

In Perth North PHN there will be three Medicare UCCs:

1. Morley Medicare UCC
2. Clarkson Medicare UCC
3. Midland Medicare UCC

The PHN will:

- Support close co-operation between Medicare UCCs, primary health care services, local emergency departments and the local health system.
- Engage local stakeholders in feasibility and sustainability discussions of UCCs in specific regional locations where issues of workforce shortage and lack of supporting services will require innovative solutions.
- Work in collaboration with the relevant state government to support the establishment of referral pathways to local emergency departments and other health care providers.
- Support and participate in relevant local and national Medicare UCC governance arrangements and where required, the Commonwealth-led evaluation of Medicare UCCs.
- Undertake relevant local communications activities to increase community awareness and understanding of the availability of services and conditions that are appropriate to be managed within a Medicare UCC.
- Support the uptake of any required training by Medicare UCC staff and the delivery of training where appropriate.
- Ensure the Medicare UCC adheres to the UCC Data Sharing Agreement, UCC Privacy Policy and the UCC Patient Consent Form (supplied separately) and provide clinics with support to complete new data fields where required.
- Support clinics to understand operational requirements as outlined in the UCC Operational Guidance (Annexure E – Medicare UCC Funding Schedule) where appropriate.
- Provide, in consultation with the relevant Medicare UCC contract manager, Commonwealth funding to the clinics where there is a justifiable need for high-cost specialist equipment and, for example, where the Medicare UCC provider cannot secure a separate agreement with a radiology or pathology provider, in line with the allocations as specified within the Medicare UCC Funding Schedule (Annexure D).

Medicare UCCs will enter into a data sharing agreement with the Department of Health and Aged Care. De-identified data will be shared with the PHN.
