- National roll-out and implementation, including legislative changes.
- Eligibility requirements for practice nurses.
- Clinical mentorship agreements.
- Prescriber partnership agreements.
- Clinical governance framework.

Given the evolving nature of this new endorsement, these webinars will not address operational matters relating to MBS billing, remuneration implications associated with additional qualifications or specific clinical governance issues.

- An independent prescriber (GP, NP) seeking clarity on mentor requirements.
- A general practice or Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Service owner or manager wanting to understand organisational requirements to implement designated RN prescribing.
- A residential aged care home manager wanting to understand how designated RN prescribing could apply in aged care.
